Spring Fire Hydrant Flushing

As part of our regular water system maintenance program, spring fire hydrant flushing will be completed between April 10th and April 14th. Please refrain from washing clothes that may be discolored during that time.

Covington Electric Aggregation Program

The Village of Covington is pleased to announce we have taken the next steps in implementing the electric aggregation program that voters approved at last November's election. The City has awarded Dynegy a contract to be the retail electric supplier for the Village of Covington's electric aggregation program. Dynegy was the lowest bidding supplier, providing a fixed electric supply rate of \$0.0529/kWh for a 36 month term beginning in April 2017 and ending in April 2020. The winning aggregation rate is 20% lower than the utility's electric supply price to compare.

Eligible residents and small business will receive an Opt-Out letter from Dynegy in late March. Eligible residents and small businesses are those DP&L accounts that remain on the utility's default electric supply rates, and are not on assistance programs such as PIPP or HEAP. The Dynegy opt-out letter will contain the standard terms and conditions for the program, and will also include instructions on how to opt-out of the Village of Covington's aggregation program if you choose. Residents and small businesses receiving the opt-out notices who want to take advantage of the aggregation rate do not need to do anything with that letter. At the end of the 21 day opt-out period, Dynegy will automatically enroll those eligible residents and small businesses who do not opt-out of the program on to the City's aggregation rate. DP&L will send these residents and small businesses a confirmation of this switch in electric suppliers to Dynegy in the weeks following.

Residents and small businesses who would otherwise be eligible for the electric aggregation program, but are currently in an electric supply contract or are month-to-month with their current electric supplier will NOT receive the Dynegy opt-out letters. It is recommended by the Village of Covington's Consultant, AGE, that residents call their current supplier to confirm their current contract's expiration date and check with their supplier to see if early termination fees will apply. If termination fees do not apply, residents can contact **Dynegy at 888-682-2170 beginning on March 24, 2017** and request to be enrolled in to the Village of Covington's aggregation program right away. If your current contract expires at a future point and termination fees will apply, AGE recommends that you wait to contact Dynegy at the above phone number about enrolling in to the Village of Covington's aggregation approximately 30 days before the current contract's expiration. This will result in a seamless switchover from your current supplier to the Village of Covington's aggregation program through Dynegy. It is also advised that you call your current supplier and inform them of your intentions at that time.
