Covington Utility Customers Utilize New On-line Invoice Services and Payment Options.

Many Covington utility customers have already registered for on-line access to their utility bills. This free service allows Covington customers to use the village website to view current or past utility bills, and consumption data. Utility customers also have the ability to make payments on-line using their checking account or major credit card.

If you have not already registered for online access you may use information obtained from your most recent utility bill to register as an on-line customer.

Utility Bill Direct Withdraw

The Village of Covington continues to offer direct withdraw from customer accounts for payment of their monthly utility bill. We currently have approximately 145 customers utilizing this service.
